History	L.R. Johnson was first elected to the House of Representatives for Hughes, NSW in 1955. Although defeated at the 1966 elections, he was re-elected in 1969 and at subsequent elections. His committee service included Publication (1962 –63, 1969 – 72), Library (1964 – 66), and Public Works (1972 – 73), Minister for Works (1973), Minister for Housing and Construction (1973 – 75) and Minister for Aboriginal Affairs (1975). Mr Johnson is a member of the Australian Labor Party.	
Record Summary	Correspondence and information files relating mainly to Mr Johnson's activities as a member of the Joint Parliamentary Committee on Public Works. Files generally contain memoranda and printed material related to proposed construction projects considered by the Committee. Some files reflect Mr Johnson's interests in foreign affairs and education.
