

Answer:

1a. Books on transnational crime will include relevant cases, statutes and principles. Try a keyword search on the [UOW Library Catalogue](#) using search terms such as **transnational and crim***; **people and smuggl***; **cybercrime**

Follow the relevant subject headings . Some examples include:

organized crime	computer security	fraud
security international	cryptography	banking
computer crimes	computer networks-security measures	-

Broader subject headings such as **International Law** and **Maritime Law** may also be useful.
