4a. [LexisNexis AU: All Subscribed Australian Case Sources](#)

Select as a source when you want a comprehensive search across a number of sources such as Australian Law Reports, CaseBase, Australian Current Law-Reporter, Intellectual Property Reports, Northern Territory Reports and the Victorian Reports. Searches catchwords.

TIP:

- At **LexisNexis AU** homepage click **Cases** tab
- Use either **Search** box with keywords or **Case Name** box
- See **Help** top right for search tips

4c. [Lexis.com](#)

TIP:

- At Lexis.com homepage Click *Legal – Find Laws by Country or Region >*
- Select **relevant country**
- **Note** not all countries have a caselaw link

4b. [AustLII](#)

This is a publicly accessible site produced by the Australasian Legal Information Institute (a joint facility of UTS and UNSW.)

TIP:

- Click **Advanced Search**
- Use the **Find** drop down menu to select the appropriate search method eg. this phrase or this boolean query etc. For example, select **this phrase**
- Type in *people smuggling*
- Limit your search to **All Case Law Databases**.

4d. [International Criminal Court](#) is a court of last resort which tries people accused of crimes against humanity and war crimes.

4e. [WorldLII's International Courts and Tribunals Project](#) provides access to the final decisions of all international and multi-national courts and tribunals, global and regional.

4f. [WorldLII: Case Law Databases](#) provides a single search facility for databases located on the following Legal Information Institutes: AustLII; BAILII; CanLII; HKLII; LII (Cornell); and PacLII as well as decisions of international Courts and Tribunals, databases from a number of Asian countries, and databases from South Africa.
